#### **ABOUT THE ARTIST**

The work of artist James Scott Geras' first show was a complete sellout, breaking all records for the gallery. Soon after, James was signed to an exclusive contract with Artbeats, Inc., an international poster art publisher with over 28,000 galleries worldwide. In addition, James appeared in Visions Art Quarterly, and was recognized by the L.A. Weekly on their list of the Top 100 Artists of the 90s

Exhibitions include the Second Annual Robert J. Lieb Memorial Art Show in Beverly Hills benefiting the Concerned Foundation for Cancer Research, the famed "Block Party on Rodeo Drive" in Beverly Hills, and the Western Heritage Museum for the Options House Celebrity Benefit hosted by entertainer Randy Travis. Geras was recognized as the only artist invited to show his work at the Bob Hope Recognition Dinner in Long Beach. Later, James was again asked back for his second "Block Party on Rodeo Drive," as well as being invited for his third consecutive year to participate in the Celebrity Art Auction held at the Rotunda on Rodeo Drive, where James received the second highest bid for the evening. James has also participated in several International Art Expos, including New York, Paris, Barcelona and Tokyo, Art Expo Las Vegas. The New York Art Expo, the "Women in Show Business for Children" celebrity benefit, the APLA Backlot Party held at Universal Studios, the Long Beach Celebrity Art Auction benefiting the Heart Association, and "Divine Design' at the Pacific Design Center to benefit Project Angel Food. In addition, the original Fixation piece, "Diva Lounging in Hell," was featured as the album cover for recording artists Spin Cycle, an exclusive champagne and chocolate reception hosted by the Hotel Group of America in San Francisco at the Diva Hotel on Union Square, and was commissioned by the City of Long Beach to design a poster commemorating the "41st Annual Grecian Festival by the Sea."

James has created a series of highly stylized fine art photographic images culminating in the project, FIXATION. The new works explore the uniqueness of the individual, and allowed for exploration of topics other than what James was best known for. But while the subject matter may be different, the overall theme of Geras' earlier works is still apparent: however, the fragmentation of image is now seen more subtly within the photograph itself. When viewing the pieces, you begin to notice intricacies within the frame and nuances that make each observation a little different than previously seen.

James lent his artistic efforts at "Angel Art" to benefit Project Angel Food. As a bonus, the work was noticed by a Los Angeles newsperson, which in turn led to Geras appearing on Los Angeles' highly-rated television program, 'The Morning Show, where he was interviewed by film critic and entertainment reporter Sam Rubin. James has also appeared on ENTERTAINMENT TONIGHT, as well as CNN.

Geras was chosen to photograph celebrity portraits for the Until There's a Cure Foundation. These portraits; To be used in their worldwide advertising campaign for "The Bracelet", have appeared on billboards and in major magazines such as <u>Vanity Fair</u>, Cosmopolitan, and <u>Vogue</u>. In addition, Virgin Atlantic picked one of James' portraits to be used in their year-long campaign for 'The Bracelet" and was featured in their in-flight magazines and in advertising at all Virgin Mega stores.

Opening Spring 2016. James is a freelance photographer shooting for several advertising agencies in New York, San Francisco, Japan, and in Los Angeles. James currently shares his time between his homes in San Francisco, California, & Whitefield, Maine.

### **Artists Statement:**



I consider myself like a parent to my art, I create it, nurture it, devote my time and love to make it the best that I can, But in time, I have to set it free and send it out into the world, what happens to it then, while it still affects me, I realize I have no control over it, In a sense, my art has become a separate, living entity to be evaluated and interpreted by all that come in contact with it.

Because of this, I feel uncomfortable when pressed to describe my work. I like for people to look at it and enjoy it as they see it. I don't like to tell people what they should be seeing. I like my pictures to tell stories, and I want people to see their own story in it.

I suppose I have been an artist all of my life, at least, it seems that all of my life's events have led me to this place and still influence the type of work that I create. My work has been called a blend of fantasy and reality, and that certainly has been the case for Me., I learned at an early age that not all things are exactly as they seem, and my work has evolved through the years. One aspect of my art has remained consistent, that there is no constant, and that reality is always just beyond the boundary of imagination.

As Such, my work is a reflection of my life, but not the reality of it and as my life is ever-evolving; my art continues to be a work in progress. But above all it's this search for the individual and the struggle for the independence of sprit that continues to drive me beyond what has been expected.

Some of my work may be seen as somewhat controversial, voyeuristic, and erotic, it is definitely sexual, but there is a playfulness to that sexuality, like a sirens song, it beckons the viewer to take part, but warns not to be fooled by the tease, it is not the dance, but only the invitation.

#### **LANDSCAPE**

Photography is as much about what is just beyond the picture frame as what is in its focus. When landscape unfolds itself in the camera lens, we find ourselves ushered to distant quiet places. But for all its nature, the true, invisible subject of pastoral imagery is time. James Scott Geras records the intersection between wilderness and humanity to reveal the coincidence between a specific moment and timelessness. His photographs seek not to distinguish landscape as civilization's foil, but to document the detente between man's design and nature's will, where moss on hewn stone and overgrown path evidence time's inexorable passage.

The truth in the rutted road and its shimmering puddle is that man's control is illusory and temporary, a reign of neverending pruning and shoring up of walls. Yet, the deep field of vision and dark silhouettes subvert concrete details and perpetuate an impression of alternate reality. The moody skies and lacey brocade of branches give life to our romantic nostalgia where we can believe that such a scene has existed for centuries. But, slowly the universal image comes into specific focus. Pattern and texture reveal the orchard, the alley, the redwood stand and we are drawn out of suspended time into scenes of France and the American West Coast. The distant chateau, the balustrade, and a looming stone tower reveal designs to live well within, albeit comfortably separate from, the landscape. Tree-lined roads, bridges and manicured gardens reflect the desire to coerce nature to a preconceived plan. However, such architecture, the ubiquitous symbol of humanity, is constantly diminished by natural growth and temporal erosion. A single large tree stands century to time, its every branch reaching skyward beyond man's control. A staircase or statue may dominate the foreground, but just outside it is the landscape that frames and patiently endures man's every ambition

Landscape photography is an art form that transcends time and space, "says James Scott Geras, whose moody and evocative nature scenes truly incorporate the notion of time and space as the representational foundation of reality. Working with a unique combination o artistic vision and refinement of photographic technique, all of Geras's photographs are taken with a long exposures commencing just at the break of sunrise, He often spends weeks scouting locations and potential camera placements prior to execution of the definitive exposure. "I set up my camera in the darkness, just before sunrise, and the long exposure creates an effect of the image emerging from afar." Where most landscape photographer's revel in a pastoral modulation of light and texture, Geras purposely seeks out a starker and bolder expressionism of the arboreal scenery. "I photograph winter landscapes because I like to see the 'bones' of nature – the skeleton of a tree, for instance, looks very much like the x-ray of the landscape," explains Geras. All of Geras's work is printed on Bergger paper, a European manufactured product that has the highest silver content of any comically available paper. Geras works closely with San Francisco master printer Leslie Kossoff in producing final prints, with particular attention to the selenium toaning. "Each print receives a different toning treatment, a degree determined by the image, with some being more heavily toned than others." Geras points out.

Geras embarked on a career in photography already at the age of 19, finding early success when a Beverly Hills art Gallery Geras had taken his work to for framing offered him a show. "I was doing photography right out of high school," Geras recalls. "My first gallery show was a sellout." Geras is somewhat unique as far as art photographers go in having been able to successfully establish his own art gallery to sell and promote his own work as well as the work of other photographers and artists. He first opened a gallery in Los Angeles 15 years ago, and after 6 years relocated the gallery to San Francisco. Just recently, a new space was acquired in the city's historic Jackson Square art and gallery district. "Photographers often lack good business sense," says Geras. "I was fortunate to grow up in a family with business experience, so I have that background. I'm very business oriented, and I'm one of the lucky few that can make art and also market myself. Having my own gallery, I enjoy complete control over how my work is hung and framed, I also have the opportunity to independently select and represent other artists."

Geras's portfolio of winter landscapes, which includes views primarily from France, but also locales from the Pacific Northwest and Northeast, was published in book form through his gallery. Geras is currently working on two new projects scheduled for publication – one is on floral, the other on the nude. "Landscape and florals have been my primary passion all along," remarks Geras, who is shooting his Florals in a studio setting to maximize technical control. As a fine art and freelance photographer, Geras has exhibited internationally in New York, Los Angeles, Paris, Barcelona and Tokyo. His commercial clients include Dolce & Gabbana, Louis Vuitton, Burberry, Ralph Lauren, Cosmopolitan, Architectural Digest, Vogue, and Vanity Fair. To name just a few of his impressive and long list of commercial and celebrity clients. "I like my pictures to tell stories, and I want people to see their own story in them," says Geras of his artistic goals. "I have learned at an early age that not all things are exactly as they seem. Although my work has evolved through the years, there's one aspect that has remained consistent. That there's no constant and that reality is always just beyond the boundary of imagination. As such, my work is a reflection of my life, and continues to be a work in progress."

Story telling through photography: the driving force behind James Scott Geras' passion.



Anyone who sees this gothic, hauntingly religious, original artistry – which Geras began developing an eye for in his earlier years – will behold a story's snapshot: a story told only in the imagination of the viewer. While retaining a history through reflection of both light and shadows over aged beauty, the pictures in this book will nonetheless be cherished for their astonishing, sometimes breathtakingly smoky power; for the revelation of authentic textures and patterns show a depth beyond the two-dimensional image on the page.

Landscape photography is an art form which can transcend time and space. What can transform one person to a place they have previously visited, can just as easily transform another to a location they only dream of reaching. What stands out most in Geras' landscape art form is that it captures your attention; the play of light and shadows pulling you from one end of the picture to the other. The preceding interpretations are not an attempt to make Geras into something more than he is, but simply to point out that similar, more metaphorical values, can be found alongside the visually descriptive function of the photographs. The landscape photographs themselves are striking in the way the balance of hues mirror through the play of angles, gently enhancing the elements of the scene.

The process of selection to some would seem to be uncomplicated. Prior to the decision of which works to used and where, the overall composition of the piece was primarily taken into consideration. From each collection in the series, ranging from landscapes in the Northwest areas of the United States to France, a single outstanding photograph was selected. The visually emerging and growing imagery Geras displays through the contrast of fantasy against the reality of the scene are what make the photographer stand above others in the vocation

**ABSOLUTE FIXATION**

Controversial voyeuristic and playfully erotic, artist James Scott Geras has challenged the fine art photography conventions of the day emerging as one of the hottest artists of his generation.

FIXATION, a series of photographic images designed to explore the uniqueness of individuality. When viewing the collection, the first thing that strikes you is the broad use of color Geras explains, "many people think that photos have to be stark, black and white images to be considered fine art. I wanted to show that art doesn't have to be somber. Art should only cause a response. It doesn't have to be serious all the time. It can be fun.

The collection is divided into several concurring themes One series, dubbed collectively as the "Diva" Collection, features the same model in various locales and situations, In one piece, titled "Snack Time", the Diva is pictured having a regal lunch at her preferential table, which is supported by two women who happen to be naked and gold leafed In another, "Good Hair Day", The Diva is presented in a photographic journey. Through consecutive shots, the series pays homage to divas of the past and present, while there is genuine 21<sup>st</sup> century attitude in a piece titled "Diva Lounging in Hell." In "Bad Hair Day", one can envision a young Audrey Hepburn on her way to Tiffanys.

A more obvious question is where do the ideas come from? "Many times, ideas will just pop in my head," explains Geras "Sometimes it is a dream I've had or maybe a fantasy that I am willing to share. One shoot I thought of while sitting in a restaurant, for some reason, I started thinking of what would happen if a spacewoman landed outside the restaurant, that is exactly what the piece, titled "Take Me to Your Leader," is all about."

The collection is printed in a limited edition of 10 with the first 3 sets only sold as a portfolio of all 15 images.
